### **Grand Knight's Report:**

- Council will host a Social Information Gathering on October 23rd. Your family is invited to come and listen to our guest speakers and for the social guests.
- A First Degree will be offered at the Father Price Council on New Hope Road on August 16th
- Council will be hosting a 3rd Degree at St. Raphael's on November 5th.
- State Golf Tournament will be held on September 10/11th in Southern Pines. Five rooms have been reserved. Cost \$115 for the golfing.
- Golf Tournament will be held in Kernersville on October 7th.
